

BEFORE YOU BUY, SCOPE THE SEWER LINE.

New home buyers understand they need a home inspection performed before they consider buying a home. One additional service they should ask for, that's not usually included in a home inspection, is a sewer line scope — repardless of the home's age.



HOW IS A SEWER SCOPED?

The scope is a snake line with a digital camera on the end that sends video back to a monitor to identify defects or obstructions in the sewer line. The video and/or still images can then be shared with homeowners, plumbers, or the local City Waste Water Department.



WHAT'S THE DAMAGE?

Depending on when the home was built, the sewer line can be composed of a variety materials. Clay, concrete, cast iron, ABS/PVC/SDR (plastic) or bituminous fiber (known as Orangeburg which is bituminized fiber pipe made from layers of wood pulp and pitch pressed together and was widely used from 1860 through the 1970s). All of these lines are susceptible to root intrusion, stone punctures, settling fractures and damage from rooter cleaning blades.



NEW BUILD DOESN'T ALWAYS MEAN WELL-BUILT
